**ASK ABOUT SCIENCE**

**1. Why is the sunset red?**

Sunlight, which appears as white, is actually a mixture of seven colours. As sunlight passes through the atmosphere, dust and clouds, it gets scattered on the way. Only red light, survives this and so, the setting of sun is seen as red.

**2. Why are the clouds up in the sky?**

A cloud is a collection of moisture in the air. The air currents keep the cloud up in the sky.

**3. Why are our hairs curly or straight?**

A cylindrical hair shaft produces straight hair. An oval shaft produces curly hair. A flattered or kidney shaped hair shaft produces woolly hair. Majority of people have straight hair.

**4. Which male creature does carry the eggs?**

Answer: Seahorse. The female seahorse after laying eggs, puts them into the broad pouch beneath the tail of the male. So it is the father who carries the eggs, until they are hatched.

**5. Why does the colour of the leaf change in autumn?**

In summer season, only chlorophyll pigment and the green colour is seen. When the season changes, the chlorophyll disappears and other pigments become visible.

**PET- Plastic Eating Bacteria**

PET or Polyethylene terephthalate, till now this has been one of the most stable compounds that man has ever created. If it wasn't so, the plastic bottle in your hand wouldn't stay the same way it was a few months back. PET is used to make a lot of things including cups, spoons, bottles etc. Since its creation in the 1940s there hasn't been a possible way to break it down till now. In March 2016 a team of Japanese scientists found a species of bacteria that eat the type of plastic found in most disposable water bottles. The bacteria Ideonella Sakaileis, uses two enzymes to break down the PET. After adhering to the PET surface, the bacteria secrete one enzyme on to the PET to generate an intermediate chemical. That chemical is then taken up by the cell, where another enzyme breaks it down even further providing the bacteria with carbon and energy to grow. The researchers report that a community of Ideonella Sakailes working this way could break down a thin film of PET over the course of 6 weeks if the temperature was held at a steady 86° Fahrenheit. Many scientists have termed this discovery as a breakthrough. The researchers at the Kyoto Institute of Technology are trying to find out a way to isolate the bacteria from the wild and release it to decompose the plastics.

**Giant Pandas**

Giant Pandas, China's national symbol, have been on the IUCN endangered list since 1990. International Union for Conservation of Nature (IUCN) is an environmental organisation that keeps track of the conservation status of plants and animals. Habitat destruction, deforestation and climate changes are attributed to this decline in the population of Pandas.

The Chinese government came forward with certain efficient and effective methods for the conservation of Panda population. It included protecting forest area, reforestation, anti-poaching patrols etc. China banned trading Panda skins. The government actively worked to restore and protect bamboo habitat. Some of the challenges faced were:

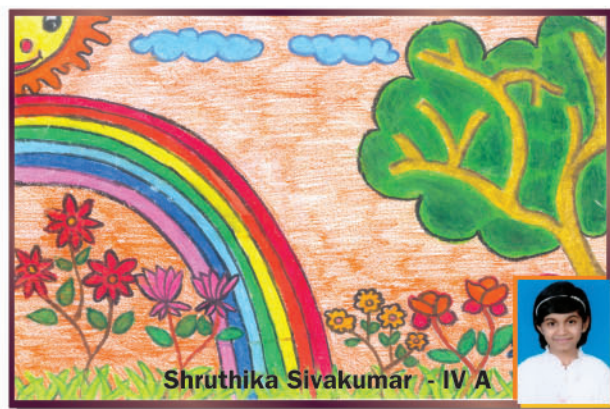
1. Pandas are poor breeders in captivity.
2. Pandas are voracious eaters.
3. Panda stomach has only one chamber; also its colon is short. The Panda has to keep eating for nearly 14 hrs a day, about 12.5kg of bamboo daily, while digesting around only 17% of it.

The fact that every Panda on earth needs 12.5kg of bamboo every single day will help us realise how important the bamboo habitat is for the Pandas. However the Chinese government's efforts to conserve Panda population proved to be effective and the total population of Pandas now exceed 2000. Following a 17% increase in population over the past 10 years, Giant Panda is officially downgraded from "Endangered" to "Vulnerable" species. "The recovery of Panda shows that when science, political will and engagement of local communities come together, we can save wild life and also improve biodiversity," Marco Lambertini, WWF Director General said about this achievement.

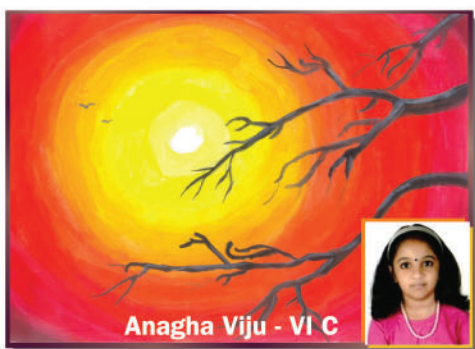
