# Man of the Millenium has Donated Rs. 30 Crore For Education of the Poor



A lot of people in this world have contributed for the mankind. But, only a few of them have been recognized and awarded for their work.

One out of the many who did a lot for the mankind and went unnoticed by our society, by our government, and by all of us is Palam Kalyanasundaram.

A man who donated his salary, in fact every single rupee of his earnings for

30 years. Not just the salary he got being a librarian for 30 years, but also his pension and later a whopping amount of Rs. 30 crore, which he received from several awards.

He was born at Melakarivelamkulam in Thirunelveli district of Tamil Nadu. He is a gold medallist in library science, and also holds a masters degree in history and literature.

The person behind his inspiration to work for humanity is none other than his mother, who inspired him to serve the poor. Today, he is around 73 years old but the confidence and determination he carries with him shines out clearly when he exchanges words in his childlike, but high pitched tone.

With the will to serve humanity and making it as his guiding principle throughout his life, Kalyanasundaram diligently and willingly donated his every month salary towards charity for 35 years. He had been working at Kumarkurupara Arts College at Srivaikuntam all these days but did some odd jobs at the same time to meet his daily needs. The whole salary he gets at the college was donated to charity.

He even slept on railway platforms and pavements that is the bed for a lot of people in our country, to personally experience what a poor person in our country goes through. Not just during the days when he was employed and was earning some handsome salary, but even after his retirement, he decided to work as a waiter in a hotel for two meals a day for himself and a meagre salary so that he can keep on contributing to the orphanages and children's educational funds.

Kalyanasundaram says money does not impress him at all. "One can get money in three possible ways. First, through earnings; secondly, through parents' earnings, and thirdly, through money donated by someone. But there's nothing more fulfilling than being able to donate money for charity out of your own earnings."

For his service to humanity, he was awarded as the best librarian in India by The Union government, one of the 'noblest of the world' by The International Biographical Centre, Cambridge, and as one of the Most Outstanding People of the 20th century by the United Nations. He was also honoured as the Man of the Millennium award and Life Time of Service Award from Rotary Club of India in 2011.

This is not just a story but it's an inspiration; inspiration to think beyond ourselves, beyond our family members and loved ones. But at the same time, it is also very important that we donate and contribute for the right people and for the right cause. So, have a thought over it and try if you too can change someone's life.

This man who donated his salary for 30 long years is a role model and an example for humanity!

# AN EXPRESSION OF EXCELLENCE IN ICSK

The Indian Community School Kuwait honoured the toppers of both the AISSE and AISSE Exams conducted in March 2015. The school had its proud moment when twelve students were deemed as subject toppers for various streams. The school shimmered with cent percent result in all the three streams, the Science, Commerce and Humanities and has centum in Chemistry and Informatics. Out of the 267 students who appeared for the exam, 98.87% of the students secured first class, 73% students secured distinction and 55 students scored an aggregate of above 90% marks. To embark with the Science stream, Pavithra Kumar embellished the honour board with a top score of 96.6%. ICSK is immensely proud to own the Kuwait Commerce stream topper Nisha Susan Eappen with 96% marks. Adding grandeur to the Class XII Board performance, Monaliza Moses D'souza enlivens the Humanities stream with a commendable top score of 89.2%. ICSK owns the glory of also having 12 Kuwait

subject toppers this year. This year class X also passed out with an impressive 100% pass percentage, ICSK students have once again brought boundless joy to the school. 26 students have scored CGPA 10 with A1 in all the subjects. Among other noteworthy achievements of the students, 81 students scored A1 grade in English, 37 students got A1 in French and 13 students got A1 in Hindi, 31 students scored the top grade of A1 in Mathematics, 65 students in Science and 67 students secured A1 in Social Science.

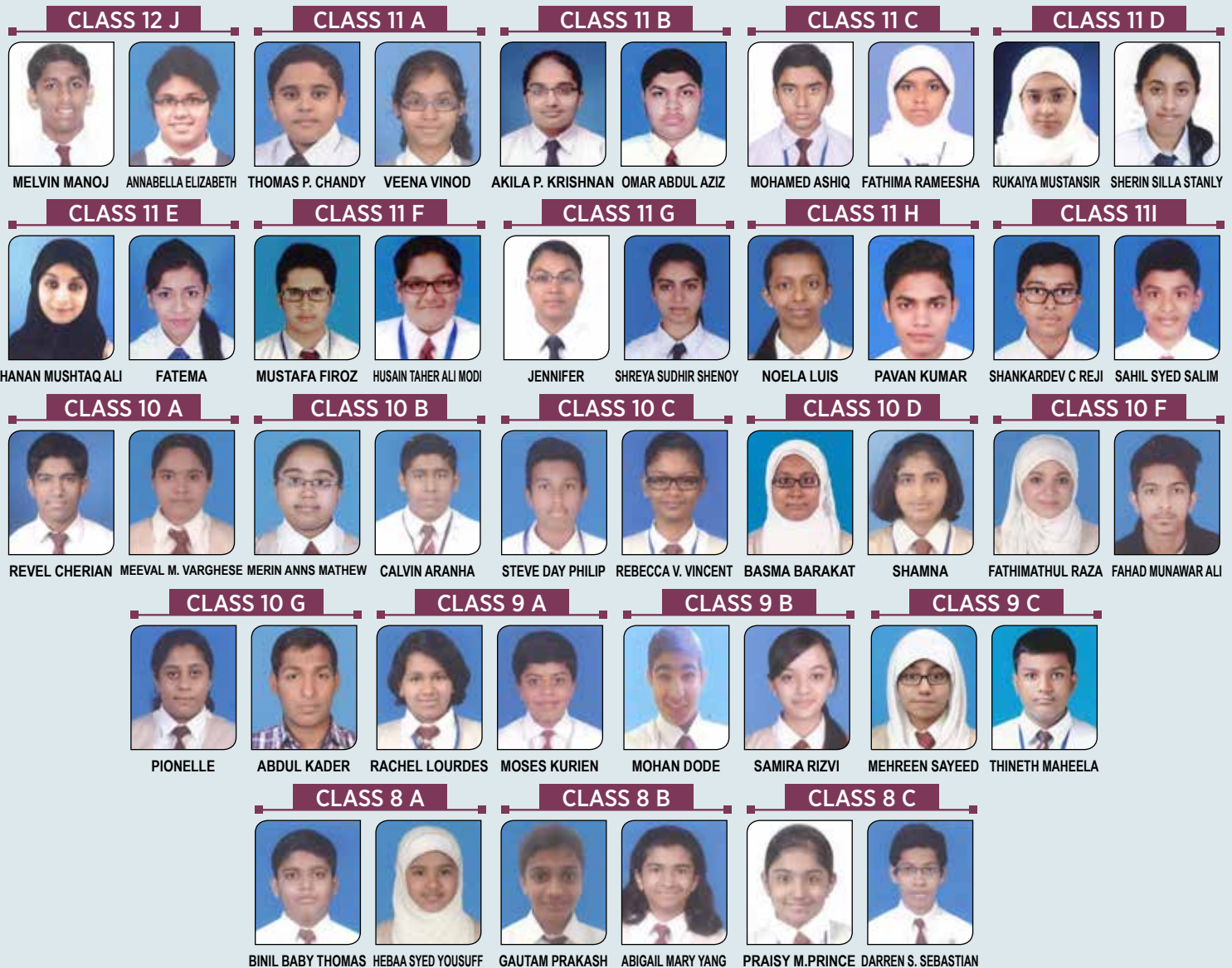

# VISIONARY OF INDIA

**"Dreams, is not what you see in sleep, is the thing which doesn't let you sleep."**

The Missile Man of India, Dr. APJ Abdul Kalam, the then President had self-effacing beginning. He was born on 15 October 1931 in the pilgrim site Rameswaram in the state Tamil Nadu.

Kalam graduated from the Shwartz Higher Secondary School, Ramanathapuram. Though he managed to have average grades he was described as a hardworking student with a strong desire to learn. He graduated from Saint Joseph College, Triruchirappalli in physics and went to Madras Institute of Technology to study Aerospace Engineering.

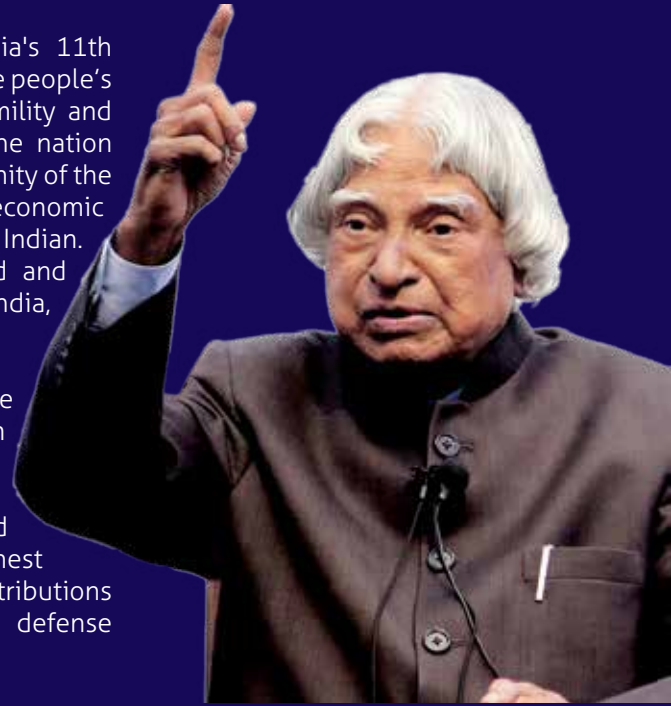
After graduating from the Madras Institute of Technology in 1960, Kalam joined the Aeronautical Development Establishment of the Defense Research and Development Organization (DRDO) as a scientist. In 1969, Kalam was transferred to the Indian Space Research Organization (ISRO) where he was the project director of India's first Satellite Launch Vehicle which successfully deployed the Rohini satellite. Kalam was a key figure in the Pokhran-II tests. Although the tests resulted in condemnation and economic sanctions from other world powers, Kalam was hailed as a national hero for his staunch defense of the country's security.

In 2002, Kalam became India's 11th president. He was known as the people's president because of his humility and accessibility. His vision for the nation was based on equality, the dignity of the individual and social justice, economic and political, to every Indian. Only then can India succeed and everybody sing the song of India, he used to say.

Among his many accolades, he holds honorary doctorates from 40 universities and he was awarded The Padma Bhushan, The Padma Vibhushan and The Bharat Ratna - India's highest civilian awards - for his contributions in modernizing government defense technology.

Kalam's advisor Sirjan Pal Singh, his student at IIM Ahmedabad writes he was a teacher, mentor, guide, co-author, friend, boss from whom I received care like a mother and concern like a father. He had a voracious appetite for knowledge. He never departed on a journey without carrying a couple of books in his hand baggage. To him the world was truly flat, and there was no place for hierarchies and ranks in his life. He had the gift of empathy – and his memory of other people's difficulties was impeccable.

On 27 July 2015, Kalam travelled to Shillong to deliver a lecture on "Creating a Livable Planet Earth" at the Indian Institute of Management Shillong. Five minutes to his lecture he collapsed, his last words, to his aide Srijan Pal Singh, were reported: "Funny guy! Are you



doing well?"

India reacted to Kalam's death with an outpouring of grief; numerous tributes were paid to the former President across the nation. The Government of India declared a seven-day state mourning period as a mark of respect.

In a special gesture, Secretary-General of the United Nations Ban Ki-moon visited the Permanent Mission of India to the UN and signed a condolence book. "The outpouring of grief around the world is a testament of the respect and inspiration he has garnered during and after his presidency. The UN joins the people of India in sending our deepest condolences for this great statesman. May his soul rest in peace and eternity", Ban wrote in his message.

# Net Neutrality

When we log on to the Internet via our computer or smartphone, we take a lot for granted. We assume we'll be able to access any website or use any application we want, whenever we want, at the fastest speed, whether it's a school website or a friend's blog. What makes all these assumptions possible is a principle called Net Neutrality. Net Neutrality means Internet freedom. It means you are free to access any kind of content on the Web without the fear of restrictions, being blocked, slowed down and other limits. Network neutrality is the guiding principle behind the freedom that Web users enjoy online.

Net neutrality in the context of the Web is somewhat new, but the concept of neutral, publicly accessible information and transfer of that information has been around since the days of Alexander Graham Bell. Basic public infrastructure, such as subways, buses, telephone companies, etc., is not allowed to discriminate, restrict, or differentiate common access, and this is the core concept behind net neutrality as well.

It has many pros. Net neutrality encourages creative expression. For example, a mom talking about her kids has the exact same opportunities to be heard online as the millionaire giving a talk to his stockholders via podcast. There are no restrictions on what or how much anyone can upload or download besides connection rates. Net Neutrality is crucial for small

business owners, who rely on the open Internet to launch their businesses, create a market, advertise their products and services, and distribute products to customers. An ISP (Internet Service Provider) could slow down its competitors' content or block political opinions it disagreed with. This would destroy the open Internet.

Just like a coin has two sides, net neutrality has another side too. ISPs, in addition to governments, can decide what parts of the Internet that people can access and what parts are blocked. ISPs can decide what types of services have preferred transfer rates. For instance, Google's Gmail could be fast while their competitors Microsoft's Hotmail could be slower, depending on how much both companies pay the ISPs.

There are many companies that have a vested interest in making sure that access to the Web is not freely available. These companies are already in charge of most of the Web's infrastructure, and they see potential profit in making the Web "pay for play". This could result in restrictions on what Web users are able to search for, download, or read. An example of a violation of net neutrality principles was the Internet service provider Comcast intentionally slowing uploads from peer-to-peer file sharing applications. A neutral internet does not discriminate between traffic; some greedy ISPs want to change that. Act now, save internet neutrality!

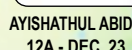
